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ADMISSION AND ENTRY

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For the purpose of instruction and assessment, communication in English is required with a prerequisite competency of numeracy and literacy in Terms of Section 37(i) of the Higher Education Act, 1997. The minimum requirement for admission to higher education institution from January 2009 is the National Senior Certificate or the National Certificate (Vocational) as determined by the Minister of Higher Education and Training. For each qualification there are entry requirements set and the APS Score on the Grade 12 (National Senior certificate / Grade 12 Certificate) must correspond with these requirements.

Learners will be selected for admission based on a potential assessment personal questionnaire and minimum academic requirements as well as an interview with a member of the institution's management.

The curriculum includes the intended outcomes (exit level outcomes, specific outcomes and critical cross-field outcomes) for the purpose of learners to demonstrate and achieve these outcomes in theory, practical and case based components.

The learning areas of the learning programme.(which include units, lessons and the accompanying planning) cover three aspects - knowledge, skills and attitudes (which include values).

The teaching and learning programme incorporates various planned activities and procedures which are incorporated to aid the trainer to help learners master the learning content.



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DELIVERY

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As part of the delivery of the qualification, trainers also use problem-based learning to improve problem solving skills and self directed learning development amongst learners.

Examples include : case-based instruction (case studies), project based teaching, essays, role plays and group discussions.

Technology is also used to promote learning in the form of media teaching (which includes the teaching in the use of products and equipment), during simulations and demonstrations on live models.

Beautiko's academic staff is committed to facilitate the progress of our learners at their own pace (through one-on-one instruction, individualised attention, workshops, re-takes, continuous assessment, guidance and mentoring.

The academic staff members of the institution are fully qualified to teach in the field of health and skincare therapy with both national and international qualifications.

Selected staff members are registered assessors and registered moderators.

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LANGUAGE AND LEARNER SUPPORT

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Beautiko College is committed to providing the support necessary to ensure that our learners are successful not only as learners but also as professional people about to enter the world of work and learner support is ongoing.

The aim of the language policy is to ensure compliance with national and departmental legislation and policies regarding language. National and International assessments are also performed in English. Formal and informal assessment measurements are done on an ongoing basis to monitor the learner's progress continuously (includes formative, summative, holistic, observations and self-assessment, also for purposes of RPL and CAT)

Examinations are also conducted and moderated.

The success of learners are recorded and reviewed as part of the QMS.

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ASSESSMENT

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Assessment integrates work-experience with academic learning and apart from the assessment of theoretical and practical components, also includes the assessment of research assignments, projects, portfolios and case studies.

Learners are expected to attend both theoretical and practical classes of all the units covered in the curriculum.

Missed hours have to be worked in for entry into the examinations. Formative and Summative Theoretical and practical evaluations are taken at the end of each semester with a final formal evaluation at the end of the fourth semester.

The final year mark consists of a weighted contribution of each of the semester assessments as well as various assignments throughout the year.

A final year mark of 50% in all practical and theoretical units is required.

Successful candidates meeting the standards of the set out criteria will receive the appropriate certification.

Re-takes will be allowed under special circumstances.
